C. Eligibility for Application

1. Master's Course

Those who apply with prospects in each application qualification will not be admitted if it is confirmed that the necessary conditions will not be obtained by the time of the admission procedure.

Applicants must meet one of the following qualifications and meet all of the application requirements described below.

- (1) Applicants who have graduated from a Japanese university or are expected to graduate by the end of the month preceding enrollment
- (2) Applicants who have received, or are expected to receive, a bachelor's degree from a Japanese university by the end of the month preceding enrollment, in accordance with Article 104, Paragraph 7 of the School Education Law.
- (3) Applicants who have completed, or are expected to complete, 16 years of education in foreign countries by the end of the month preceding enrollment.
- (4) Applicants who reside in Japan and have completed, or are expected to complete, 16 years of education through correspondence courses offered by foreign-affiliated educational institutions by the end of the month preceding enrollment.
- (5) Applicants who have completed a program of a foreign university at an educational institution in Japan recognized as offering such programs within the foreign country's education system and specifically designated by MEXT (limited to programs whose completion is regarded as equivalent to 16 years of school education in that country), or who are expected to complete such a program by the end of the month preceding enrollment
- (6) Applicants who have completed a program of three or more years at a foreign university or other foreign educational institution (limited to institutions whose overall educational and research activities have been evaluated by an evaluator certified by the relevant government or its related agency, or designated as equivalent by MEXT), including programs completed through correspondence education provided by the foreign institution while residing in Japan or at an educational institution in Japan recognized under the foreign education system as specified in the preceding item, and who have been awarded a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree, or who are expected to be awarded such a degree by the end of the month preceding enrollment.
- (7) Applicants who have completed a specialized course at a vocational school (limited to programs with a duration of four or more years and meeting other criteria established by MEXT) that has been specifically designated by MEXT, on or after a date prescribed by MEXT, or who are expected to complete such a course by the end of the month preceding enrollment.
- (8) Applicants designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (Ministry of Education Notification No. 5 of 1953), including:
 - ① those who have completed programs at former educational institutions under the old system
 - ② those who have completed programs at institutions such as the National Defense Academy, National Defense Medical College, National Fisheries University, Japan Coast Guard Academy, and Meteorological College, as specified
- (9) Applicants who have been admitted to another graduate school in accordance with Article 102, Paragraph 2 of the School Education Law and are recognized by the relevant graduate school or program of this university to which they seek admission as having adequate academic ability to pursue

graduate-level education.

- (10) Applicants who are recognized, through an individual entrance qualification screening conducted by the relevant graduate school or program of this university, as having academic ability equivalent to or exceeding that of university graduates, and who will reach the age of 22 by the time of enrollment.
- (11) Applicants who, by the end of the month preceding enrollment, have been enrolled in a university for three or more years, or have completed 15 years of school education in a foreign country (including completion via correspondence education offered by a foreign university while residing in Japan), or have completed a 15-year program at an educational institution in Japan recognized under a foreign education system and designated by MEXT, and are recognized by the relevant graduate school or program of this university as having earned the required credits with excellent academic performance.
- (12) International applicants (or those treated equivalently) from countries where completion of a university program requires less than 16 years of education, who meet all of the following conditions and are recognized by the relevant graduate school or program of this university as having academic ability equivalent to or exceeding that of graduates of Japanese universities:
 - a. Applicants who, after completing university education, have engaged in research activities for approximately one year or more as a research student, researcher, or equivalent at a university, inter-university research institute, or comparable research institution in Japan or abroad, or are expected to do so by the end of the month preceding enrollment
 - b. Applicants who will reach the age of 22 by the time of enrollment

Notes

Note 1: The institutions referred to in item (8)② include the National Defense Academy, National Defense Medical College, National Fisheries University, Japan Coast Guard Academy, the long-term course of the Polytechnic University, and the Meteorological College.

Note 2: Applicants applying under items (9) through (12) are required to undergo a preliminary eligibility screening. Please refer to “Preliminary Screening of Application Eligibility” and complete the prescribed procedures in advance.

Online application registration and payment of the examination fee will be available from 9:00 a.m. on the first day of each application period.

All required application documents must arrive by 5:00 p.m. on the application deadline.

Documents must be sent by registered express mail (EMS or other traceable means if mailing from abroad) so that they arrive within the application period.

Documents that arrive after the application period will not be accepted. Applicants are advised to send documents well in advance, taking postal conditions into consideration.

However, for registered express mail sent from within Japan only, applications will be accepted even if they arrive after the application deadline, provided that the envelope bears a postmark dated on or before the day prior to the application deadline (limited to postmarks issued within Japan).

If application documents are submitted in person, they will be accepted on weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. during the application period.

Please note that in-person submission is not permitted for the Graduate School of Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences and the Graduate School of Science and Engineering.

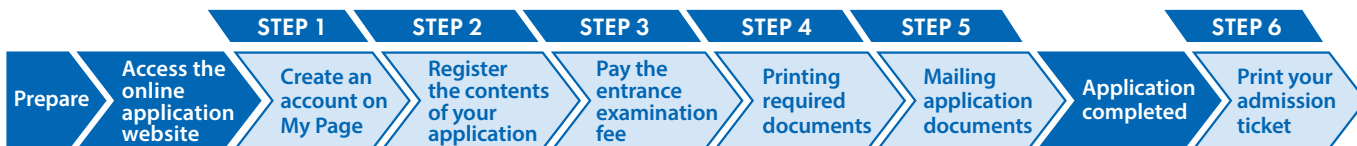
In addition, the University will not respond to inquiries regarding whether application documents sent by registered express mail have arrived.

Applicants must check the delivery status themselves using Japan Post’s “Postal Tracking Service.”

2. Application Procedures

Applications must be submitted online only. The application procedure is completed by sending the required documents by registered express mail within the application period after the registration and payment of the application fee on the online application website. Please read the following "Online Application Procedure" carefully and follow the instructions.

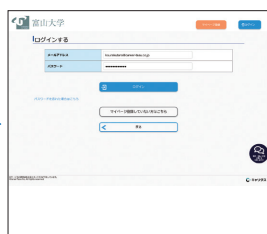

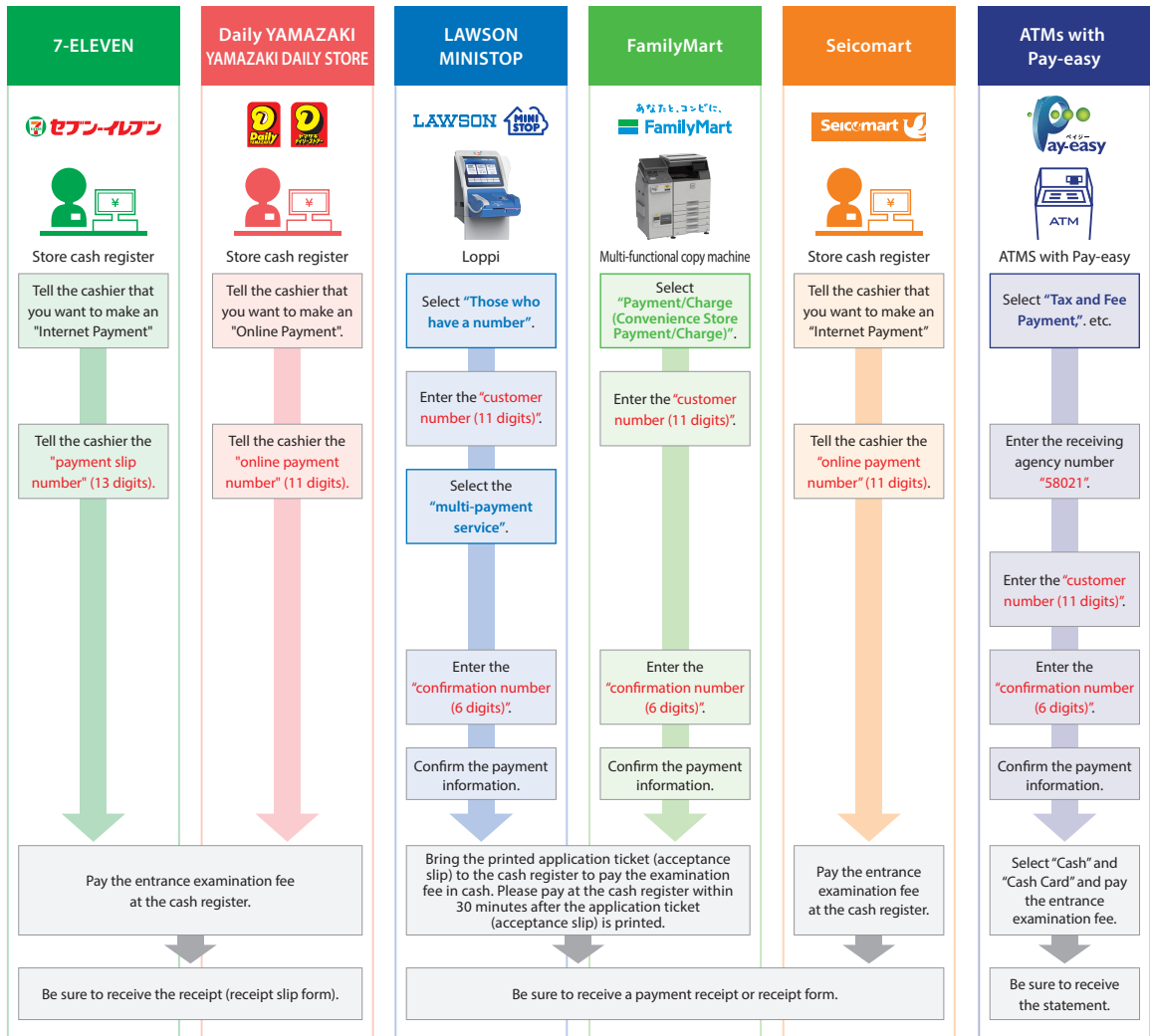

4. Examination Fee

The examination fee is ¥30,000.

Payment of the examination fee must be made after completing the registration of application details in STEP 2.

In Japan, payment may be made via convenience store, credit card, internet banking, or Pay-easy-compatible post office/bank ATM.

Outside Japan, payment must be made by credit card. Additional handling fees apply.

After payment of the examination fee has been completed, applicants will be able to print out the Application Form.

5. Notes on Application

- ① The use of generative AI tools such as ChatGPT is prohibited in documents prepared by the applicant.
- ② Applications with incomplete or incorrect documents may not be accepted.
- ③ Once submitted, application documents will not be returned under any circumstances.
- ④ Even after admission has been granted, admission may be revoked if any discrepancy is found between the submitted documents and the facts.
- ⑤ Applications with an insufficient examination fee will not be accepted.
- ⑥ Changes to submitted documents after completion of the application procedure are not permitted.
- ⑦ Applicants who fail to take any part of the required examination will be excluded from the selection process.

6. Printing of the Admission Ticket and Examination Instructions

- (1) After the University has received the application documents submitted by the applicant, the

admission ticket will become available for printing on the online application system on or after the specified issue date. Applicants will be notified by email (registered at the time of application) once printing becomes available.

- (2) Log in to your My Page via the “Login” section of the online application system. You will need your registered email address and password.
- (3) After logging in, download the admission ticket. Print it in color on A4 paper and bring it with you on the examination day.

Important Notes

- (1) After printing the admission ticket, be sure to verify all printed information. If any discrepancies are found, contact the relevant graduate school immediately.
Also confirm that the examination number displayed on screen matches the number on the printed ticket.
- (2) Even if you do not receive the notification email, please log in to the online application system and print the admission ticket.
- (3) The reception number assigned at the time of online application is not the examination number.
You cannot take the examination using the reception number. Be sure to bring the admission ticket.
- (4) Presentation of the admission ticket on a smartphone or other device will not be accepted.
You must bring a printed copy and keep it after the examination.

7. Misconduct

- (1) The following actions constitute misconduct.

If misconduct is identified, the applicant will be instructed to stop the examination and leave the examination room immediately. The applicant will not be allowed to continue, and all examination results will be invalidated.

- a. Intentionally registering false information in the online application system or altering the admission ticket or related documents
- b. Making intentional false entries on the answer sheet (e.g., writing another person’s examination number)
- c. Cheating (e.g., referring to notes, books, or other materials; looking at other applicants’ answers; receiving assistance from others)
- d. Assisting other applicants in cheating
- e. Removing examination question booklets before the end of the examination time
- f. Removing answer sheets from the examination room
- g. Opening the question booklet or beginning to answer before instructed

- h. Using unauthorized devices (e.g., rulers, compasses, calculators)
- i. Using electronic devices such as mobile phones, smartphones, wearable devices, tablets, electronic dictionaries, IC recorders, earphones, or music players during the examination
- j. Continuing to write after being instructed to stop

(2) Online Examinations

In addition to the above, the following actions also constitute misconduct.

- a. Having another person take the examination on your behalf
- b. Communicating with others or receiving assistance during the examination
- c. Providing false answers during an interview examination
- d. Disclosing examination-related content through recording, photographing, or communication
- e. Failing to follow instructions given by the examination staff

(3) Other Misconduct

In addition to the above, the following may also be considered misconduct.

- a. Keeping unauthorized items or devices on your person during the examination
- b. Disrupting the examination (e.g., phone alerts or alarms)
- c. Making false statements to gain an unfair advantage
- d. Behaving in a way that disturbs other applicants
- e. Failing to follow instructions of proctors
- f. Any other act that may compromise the fairness of the examination

If any additions or changes occur to items (1)–(3), applicants will be notified via the University website and the online application system.

8. Enrollment Procedures

Details of the enrollment procedures will be provided to successful applicants.

(1) Fees Required for Enrollment

- a. Admission Fee ¥282,000 (tentative amount)

Notes:

- ① The above admission fee is a tentative amount. If the fee is revised, the revised amount will apply.
- ② The admission fee, once paid, will not be refunded under any circumstances.

b. Other Matters

- ① If payment of the admission fee is deemed difficult, the fee may be exempted or payment

deferred upon application and screening.

② Tuition must be paid after enrollment.

The amount and payment method will be provided at the time of enrollment procedures.

③ A loan-type scholarship program provided by the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) is available.

④ Additional expenses, such as Student Education and Research Accident Insurance, are required separately.

(2) Applicants who do not complete the enrollment procedures within the specified period will be regarded as having declined admission.

9. Protection of Personal Information of Applicants

Personal information held by the University will be handled in accordance with the Act on the Protection of Personal Information and the University of Toyama Personal Information Protection Regulations.

(1) The names, addresses and other personal information of applicants learned at the time of application shall be used for ① selection of students to be enrolled (application processing, implementation of selection), ② announcement of successful applicants, ③ admission procedures, ④ survey/study in the selection method of enrolled students, and ⑤ operations associated with these purposes.

(2) Among the personal information learned at the time of application, only the information of those who completed the procedures for admission to our university shall be used for post-admission operations related to ① educational instruction (school registry, attending instruction, etc.), ② student support (health management, application for tuition waiver/scholarship, career support, etc.), ③ collection of tuition, and ④ statistical survey and data analysis.

(3) Only the applicant ID numbers, names and addresses of successful applicants may be used for contact with the organizations associated with the university, alumni association and co-op. Note: Applicants who do not wish to receive such communications should notify the relevant graduate school.

(4) In the use of personal information for various types of operations, some of the operations may be conducted by a vendor contracted with the relevant operations from our university (hereinafter referred to as “contractor”). When contracting the operations, all or part of the personal information learned shall be provided to the contractor within the limit necessary to perform the contracted operations. We supervise the use of information to ensure compliance with confidentiality.

10. Security Export Control

At University of Toyama, based on the Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Act, the University has established the “University of Toyama Regulations on Security Export Control” and conducts strict screening from the perspectives of technology transfer and export of goods.

If an applicant falls under regulated categories, admission may not be granted, or there may be restrictions on the education or research activities that the applicant wishes to pursue.

Applicants are therefore advised to take this into careful consideration when applying.

1 3. Pre-Application Consultation for Applicants with Disabilities

Applicants with disabilities or other conditions (such as visual impairment, hearing impairment, physical disabilities, chronic illness, injuries, developmental disorders, etc.) who require special accommodations for entrance examinations and/or academic study must consult with the relevant graduate school prior to application.

(2) Method of Consultation

Prepare an application document including the following information, and submit it to the relevant graduate school together with a medical certificate (a copy is acceptable) and any other supporting documents.

- ① Name, gender, date of birth, address, telephone number, and email address
- ② Desired program and type of entrance examination
- ③ Type and degree of disability or condition
- ④ Special accommodations required during the entrance examination
- ⑤ Special accommodations required during academic study
- ⑥ Measures taken at the applicant’s previous institution (including comments from a supervising instructor)
- ⑦ Current living conditions
- ⑧ Other relevant information

(Any supporting materials useful for consultation should also be submitted, e.g., a copy of a






disability certificate)

Note:

If applicants wish to use assistive devices such as hearing aids, crutches, or wheelchairs in daily life during the entrance examination, prior consultation is required, as special arrangements for the examination venue may be necessary.

Pre-application consultation is intended to help applicants with disabilities understand the University's current conditions in advance and to identify the most appropriate methods and arrangements for both the examination and academic study. It is not intended to restrict applicants with disabilities from taking the examination or pursuing their studies.
